FOOD & DRINK POLICY

NOTEBOOKS

We will periodically check together, during class, that our notebooks are in the correct order. As we do not have a textbook you will be taking home with you for this course, your notebook and binder is your key to success!

HOMEWORK POLICY

In order for you to be successful, it is critical for you to complete assigned homework daily. In order for homework to be considered complete, every problem must be completed with the work shown. Homework will be checked in class daily.

If you miss three homework assignments, there will be parental contact to discuss ways to help you complete your homework.

ABSENCES AND GRADES

Attendance and punctuality to every class is a necessity. You will be expected to be in your seat each day and ready to begin class before the tardy bell rings. It is your responsibility to see me after an absence to collect any make up work.

It is your responsibility to collect and turn in any make-up work to me. You will have 5 school days from the date you return to school to complete and turn in any make-up work. You will be given full credit for make-up work handed in within this time frame. After 5 school days, the work will be considered late and will be graded as such.
